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WORD STUDY > LATIN ROOT: -VIS-

The **Latin root** *-vis-* means "see" or "look at." For example, the word *revise* literally means "to look again." When you revise something, you look back over it in order to improve it. **Note:** Sometimes this root is spelled *-vid-*, as in the word *videotape*.
